

Cambridgeshire County Council, (Various Roads, Elm), (Speed Limits)  
(Consolidation), Order 202-

Cambridgeshire County Council proposes to make an Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and all other enabling powers. The effect of this Order will be to introduce the following speed limits in the parish of Elm;

To introduce a 20mph speed limit on the whole length of a number of roads in the Parish of Elm (including Fridaybridge) and on parts of Begdale Road, Fridaybridge Road (B1101), Gosmoor Lane, Main Road, Fridaybridge (B1101), Maltmas Drove, March Road (B1101) and Well End. Full details can be found in the Order documents.

To introduce a 30mph speed limit on Begdale Road from a point 412 metres west of its junction with Main Road in a westerly direction for 233m.

To introduce a 40mph speed limit on Gosmoor Lane from a point 414m east of its junction with Main Road in an easterly direction for 390m, on Wales Bank from a 246m west of its junction with Fridaybridge Road in a westerly direction for 474m, on Maltmas Drove, Fridaybridge from a point 74m south west of its junction with Kilderkin Close in a south westerly direction for 452m.

For administrative purposes all previous speed limit Orders in the Parish of Elm will be revoked, though their effects, as amended by the proposed, shall be consolidated into this Order.
